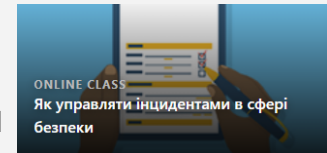


New: Managing Security Incidents: 10-min mobile guide now available in Polish, Russian and Ukrainian

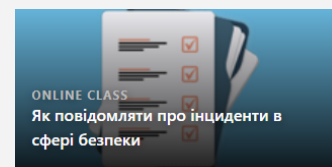

Safety, security and access incidents

Incidents of threats and violence affecting aid workers and aid delivery.

Africa

Democratic Republic of the Congo

06 September 2022: In Mekima forest, near Bango village, Mambasa territory, Ituri province, a male Red Cross worker was reportedly killed by ADF fighters. **Sources:** [Actualité](#) and [Media Congo](#)

Ethiopia

24 August 2022: In Mekelle city and special zone, Tigray region, a WFP warehouse was forcefully entered by TPLF members who reportedly stole 12 fuel trucks. **Source:** [Sudan Tribune](#)

Mali

18 August 2022: Between Tidarmene and Achibogo villages, Menaka region, an ICRC vehicle was reportedly seized by an armed group. The vehicle was later recovered. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

26 August 2022: In Lere town, Tombouctou region, the offices of an INGO were broken into by an unidentified armed group. Three motorcycles, computers, and other items were taken. One motorcycle was later found. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

30 August 2022: In Ansongo town, Gao region, the offices of two INGOs were reportedly searched by the Malian Armed Forces and mercenaries of the Wagner Security Group. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

01 September 2022: In Gao city and region, an ICRC vehicle was reportedly seized by an unidentified armed group. The vehicle was later recovered. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

Niger

19 August 2022: Near Wailabon village, Ayerou commune, Tillaberi region, five LINGO aid workers along with their vehicle were kidnapped by suspected IS-affiliated militants. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

Nigeria

As reported on 31 August 2022: Update: In Maiduguri city, Borno state, an International Rescue Committee staff member, who was kidnapped by ISWAP fighters during an attack on Monguno town last March, has been released. **Source:** [HumAngle](#)

South Sudan

25 August 2022: In Fangak county, Upper Nile state, the WFP suspended its barge movements along river roads due to increasing taxation and illegal checkpoints. As a result, displaced people in the area risk starvation. **Source:** [Eye Radio](#)

Sudan

As reported on 28 August 2022: Near El Fasher city, North Darfur state, a truck loaded with WFP supplies was shot at by plainclothes armed men whilst en route to the Zamzam IDP camp. A driver was shot and taken to the El Fasher Teaching Hospital for treatment. **Source:** [Darfur 24](#)

As reported on 04 September 2022: In Hamdayet village, near the Sudan-Ethiopia-Eritrea border, Kassal state, an intensification of clashes involving the ENDF and Eritrea forces and the

TPLF prompted Sudanese authorities to urge humanitarian actors to evacuate the Hamdayet Border Reception Centre for Ethiopians, citing fears for their safety. **Source:** [Sudan Tribune](#)

06 September 2022: Between Manaqil town and Al Jamusi locality, Gezira state, three MSF pick-up trucks loaded with mosquito nets, blankets, plastic sheets, mats, kitchen pots and buckets, were stopped by two unidentified youths whilst en route to floods-affected communities. Other bystanders and passersby joined the youth and looted supplies. **Source:** [MSF](#)

Asia

20 August 2022: In Myeik town, township and district, Tanintharyi region, a male LNGO volunteer aid worker was killed by SAC forces who rammed their military car toward the victim's motorbike for allegedly not stopping at a checkpoint. **Source:** [Khit Thit Media](#)

27 August 2022: In Pu Gaw Zun village and village tract, Yebyu township, Dawei district, Tanintharyi region, a male volunteer ambulance driver for the LNGO Zabu Yeik was shot dead by two armed men. **Source:** [Telegram](#)

01 September 2022: In Nan Mar town, Mohnyin township and district, Kachin state, a male volunteer aid worker was arrested by SAC forces. **Source:** [DVB](#)

Europe

Ukraine

29 August 2022: In Sloviansk city, Kramatorsk raion, Donetsk oblast, a building that had been used by the Ukrainian Red Cross Society to accommodate its Emergency Response Team involved in the evacuation of civilians, was struck by four Russian 152-mm shells, severely damaging it, its vehicles, and materials. **Sources:** [Euromaidan Press](#) and [ICRC](#)

As reported on 01 September 2022: In Olenivka settlement, Kalmiuske raion, Donetsk oblast, a group of ICRC officials involved in negotiations with Russian authorities has not been granted access to 1,800 Ukrainian Prisoners of War, mainly soldiers from the Azovstal complex, and has not been afforded security guarantees to carry out such a visit. **Source:** [Reuters](#)

Middle East North Africa

Israel

30 August 2022: The former Gaza Head of the INGO World Vision was issued a 12-year prison sentence for allegedly funnelling funds to Hamas. **Source:** [France 24](#)

Yemen

03 September 2022: Update: Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula released a video, apparently recorded on 09 August, featuring a Bangladeshi UN staff member who was kidnapped by the group in Aden city last February, urging the UN, the international community, and humanitarian organisations to meet the demands of his captors, without specifying what the latter are. **Source:** [The New Arab](#)
