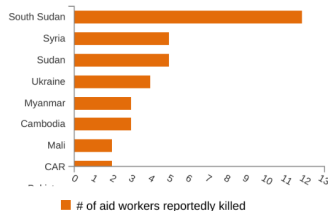


Latest Aid Worker KIKA Data

Data on incidents where aid workers were killed, injured, kidnapped or arrested (KIKA) is now available for download on [HDX](#) and our [website](#) covering the period 01 January to 26 September 2022. The dataset includes a brief incident description, the reported perpetrator, the weapons used, the type of organisation and programme affected as well as anonymised available details about the affected staff. Note: The dataset does not yet include incidents reported in this News Brief.

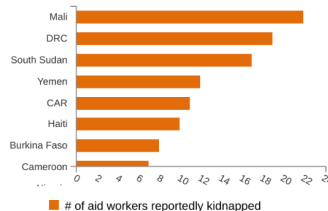
Aid workers reportedly killed, by country, in 2022 to date

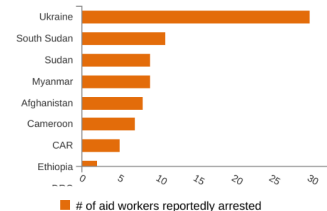
Aid workers reportedly kidnapped, by country, in 2022 to date

Safety, security and access incidents

Incidents of threats and violence affecting aid workers and aid delivery.

Africa

Democratic Republic of the Congo

14 September 2022: Near Beni city and territory, North Kivu province, a WFP vehicle was ambushed and set on fire by Allied Defence Forces (ADF). **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

Ethiopia

As reported on 14 September 2022: A resumption of fighting between the ENDF and TPLF in late-August has resulted in a full cessation of humanitarian access, including all aid deliveries, to Tigray region and conflict-affected areas in Amhara region. **Source:** [The New Arab](#)

Republic of the Congo

Around 12 September 2022: In Brazzaville city, two human rights defence NGOs were looted by unidentified armed men. The NGOs suspect the military to be the culprit. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

Asia

Myanmar

05 September 2022: In Let Pan village and village tract, Gangaw township and district, Magway region, the LNGO-ran Tipitaka Metta Hospital was raided by the Myanmar military armed with firearms. Health workers were forced to sign a document stating that they would not offer medical care to the local defence forces. Staff mobile phones and valuables were taken. **Sources:** [Facebook](#) and [Khit Thit Media](#)

As reported on 08 September 2022: In Loikaw town and township, Kayah state, in June 2022, the Myanmar military imposed a regulation which required personal details for bulk buying of medicines. Since then, the seizure of medicine cargoes and blockade of medicine transport became increasingly frequent, according to reports by LNGOs offering aid to IDPs in Kayah state. **Source:** [Facebook](#)

09 September 2022: Near Pein Hne Taw village, Kyaung Ywar village tract, Thanbyuzayat township, Mawlamyine district, Mon state, two ambulances belonging to the LNGO Aung Mingalar were attacked with small firearms. A landmine detonated, damaging one of the ambulances and critically injuring two volunteer aid workers. The ambulances were on the way back to Ye town from Mawlamyine town after dropping off patients. The local defence forces issued a statement denying responsibility. **Sources:** [Ayeyarwaddy Times](#), [DVB](#) and [Radio Free Asia](#)

14 September 2022: Near Na Bar village and village tract, Katha township and district, Sagaing region, the bodies of four volunteer aid workers of the LNGO Phyu-sin-metta were found. The victims were reported missing on 22 August 2022. A local defence force claimed that they killed the victims on 21 August for allegedly being military informants. **Sources:** [Eleven Media](#), [Myanmar Now](#) and [Voice of Myanmar](#)

16 September 2022: At the Mrauk-U town entry checkpoint, Mrauk-U township and district, Rakhine state, the Myanmar military opened fire at a civilian vehicle of five volunteer aid workers on their way to deliver aid to IDPs. One bullet hit the vehicle, but no casualties were reported. **Sources:** [DVB](#), [Development Media Group](#) and [Radio Free Asia](#)

16 September 2022: In Rakhine state, letters were issued to unspecified LNGOs and INGOs by the Rakhine Ministry of Security and Border Affairs barring them from delivering food and other aid to Buthidaung, Maungdaw, Rathedaung, Mrauk-U, Minbya and Myebon townships in Rakhine state starting 16 September. The ban was issued following clashes between the Myanmar military and the Arakan Army. **Sources:** [DVB](#), [Narinjara](#), [Narinjara II](#), [Radio Free Asia](#), and [Western News](#)

19 September 2022: In Toungup town and township, Thandwe district, Rakhine state, two male volunteers for the LNGO Kaing Shey were detained at a military compound. **Source:** [Narinjara](#)

Pakistan

As reported on 08 September 2022: In Basti Ahmad Din village, Jhang district, Punjab province, as monsoon rains flooded most of the area, women and girls of Baloch ethnicity have been prevented from evacuating to safer areas by their male counterparts under a strict 'honour system', which prohibits them from interacting with other men outside their families. As a result, women and girls have been cut off from basic needs, such as food and health care. **Source:** [The New Arab](#)

Ukraine

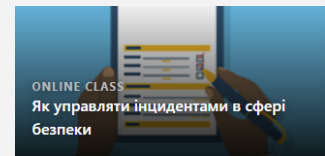
As reported on 07 September 2022: Update: Russian authorities have returned the body of a 45-year-old British independent aid worker to Ukraine with multiple wounds and signs of torture, clearly showing that the man was killed violently, and did not die due to chronic diseases and psychological stress, as the Donetsk authorities had claimed. **Source:** [The Insider](#)

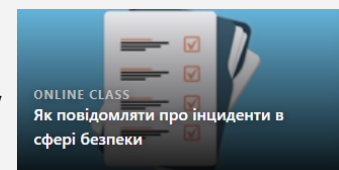


Reporting Security Incidents

As reported on 30 August 2022: Israeli authorities are increasingly expelling or refusing to grant visas for staff of the UN Human Rights Commission, UN, and INGOs. **Source:** [UN News](#)
