## Safety, security and access incidents

Incidents of threats and violence affecting aid workers and aid delivery.

### Africa

#### *Democratic Republic of the Congo*

**30 June 2023:** In Beni city, North Kivu province, an NGO aid worker was reportedly killed by unidentified armed men. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

#### *Ethiopia*

**08 June 2023:** A widespread and coordinated campaign to divert donated wheat intended to those in need has forced USAID to suspend food aid to all of Ethiopia. On 09 June, WFP announced that it would be doing the same, affecting 20 million people in need. **Sources:** [ABC](#), [Al Jazeera I](#), [Al Jazeera II](#), [Fox](#) and [Doctors Without Borders](#)

#### *Mali*

**05 July 2023:** In Bintagoungou village, Goundam commune, Tombouctou region, an NGO consultant was reportedly kidnapped by JNIM militants along with a vehicle. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

**06 July 2023;** In Niafunke town and cercle, Niafunke, Tombouctou region, an unspecified number of NGO staff members were reportedly kidnapped by JNIM militants along with two vehicles. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

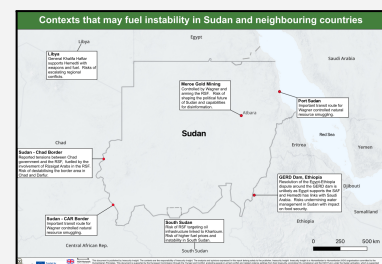
#### *South Sudan*

**02 July 2023:** In Yambio county, Western Equatoria state, a national UN aid worker was reportedly injured in a robbery at her home by criminals who robbed money. **Source:** [AWSO](#)<sup>2</sup>

### Conflict Developments and Implications for Aid Agencies

The Jeddah Declaration of Commitment to Protect the Civilians of Sudan had a limited focus on humanitarian issues, while subsequent ceasefires had practically no effect on the fighting. Any spillover effects of the Sudanese conflict on neighbouring countries may affect aid operations regionally. Attempts to influence the conflict through sanctions are highly likely to affect aid operations. This [report](#) provides insight on the conflicts developments and their implications for aid agencies.



**07 June 2023:** In El Genina city, West Darfur state, a Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) IDP camp manager was killed by armed men while off duty. **Source:** [NRC](#) and [UN OCHA Sudan](#)

**04 July 2023:** In Omdurman city, Khartoum state, a Health Ministry was killed when he was hit by a bullet whilst inside the MSF-supported Saudi Maternity Hospital. The hospital was subsequently closed, with staff looking for a safer place to resume services. **Source:** [MSF Sudan](#)

**07 July 2023:** In El Geneina city, West Darfur, a Red Crescent vehicle was reportedly seized by an armed militia and used to move dead bodies. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

**As reported on 11 July 2023:** In El Obeid city, North Kordofan state, RSF soldiers attacked a humanitarian convoy loaded with more than 1,770 cartons, and seized about 70 percent of the load, which were subsequently being sold in markets. **Source:** [Radio Dabanga](#)

## Europe

### Ukraine

**29 June 2023:** In Kherson city and oblast, a humanitarian aid distribution point was reportedly shelled by Russian forces, killing two civilians and wounding two others. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

**30 June 2023:** Near Makiivka city, Luhansk region, a Ukrainian volunteer aid worker was reportedly injured when Russian forces shelled near the vehicle she was in. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

**05 July 2023:** In Sadove village, Kherson oblast, a humanitarian aid distribution point was reportedly shelled by Russian forces, injuring a civilian. **Source:** [ACLED](#)<sup>1</sup>

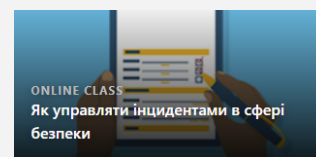
**09 July 2023;** In Orikuh city, Polohy raion, Zaporizhzhia oblast, a humanitarian distribution point was hit by Russian forces bombing. Several civilians were killed and injured and a drinking water point installed and maintained by a UN Ukraine Humanitarian Fund partner was destroyed. **Sources:** [European Commissioner for Crisis Management](#), [Personal Communication](#), [UN Ukraine I](#) and [UN Ukraine II](#)

**11 July 2023:** In Kherson oblast, a humanitarian distribution point was attacked. **Source:** [UN Ukraine](#)

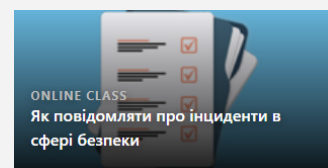
### Managing Security Incidents Mobile Guide

## Middle East North Africa

### Libya

**07 July 2023:** Off the coast of Castelverde town, Tripoli district, Tripolitania region, a Libyan Coastguard patrol vessel approached with high speed a rescue operation by the NGO vessel Ocean Viking, operated by SOS Mediterranee and the IFRC, and fired multiple shots at close range, causing injuries to passengers onboard. **Sources:** [Euractiv](#) and [IFRC](#)

### Occupied Palestinian Territories

**03-04 July 2023:** In the Jenin Refugee Camp, Jenin city and governorate, West Bank, Israeli forces confiscated the keys of two ambulances belonging to the PRCS, and seized the mobile phones of staff responding to an emergency call. **Sources:** [MAP](#) and [Mondoweiss](#)

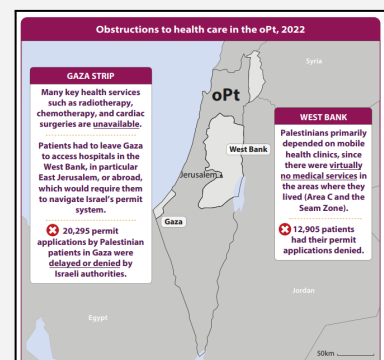
**03-04 July 2023:** In the Jenin Refugee Camp, Jenin city and governorate, West Bank, Israeli forces obstructed a PRCS ambulance carrying a pregnant woman in labour on its way to hospital. **Source:** [MAP](#)

**03 July 2023:** In the Jenin Refugee Camp, Jenin city and governorate, West Bank, all UNRWA installations, including one health centre and four schools, were unable to operate due to violence and insecurity in the camp. Some sustained damages. **Sources:** [Personal Communication](#) and [UNRWA](#)

**04 July 2023:** In the Jenin Refugee Camp, Jenin city and governorate, West Bank, Israeli forces fired teargas several times inside the Khalil Suleiman Hospital, rendering the Emergency Room unusable due to smoke. **Sources:** [MSF International I](#) and [MSF International II](#)

### 171 Attacks on Health Care in the oPt in 2022

This factsheet - available in [Arabic](#) and [English](#) - published by the Safeguarding Health in Conflict Coalition (SHCC) identified 171 incidents of violence against or obstruction of health care in the oPt in 2022. Violence resulted in the temporary closure of health facilities, and health care was interrupted during hospital raids. Palestinians seeking health care continued to be delayed or denied access to care by Israel's permit system. Closures of crossings and roads further reduced access to health care. This factsheet is based on the dataset [2022 SHCC Health Care oPt Data](#), which is available for download on HDX.

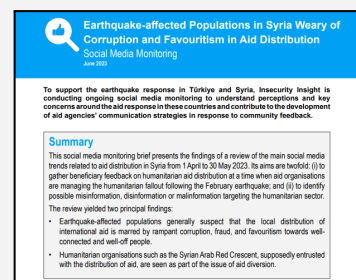


### Syrian Arab Republic

**11 July 2023:** In Atrib town, Aleppo governorate, a Syrian LNGO volunteer was killed in a double-tap airstrike by Syrian regime forces that reportedly targeted the rescue's team's vehicle with a guided missile. He was killed while conducting inspections in areas that had been targeted by artillery shelling from Syrian regime forces. **Sources:** [Syrian Civil Defence I](#) and [Syrian Civil Defence II](#)

### Earthquake-affected Populations Weary of Corruption and Favouritism in Aid Distribution

This [social media monitoring brief](#) presents the findings of a review of the main social media trends related to aid distribution in Syria from 1 April to 30 May 2023. Its aims are twofold: (i) to gather beneficiary feedback on humanitarian aid distribution at a time when aid organisations are managing the humanitarian fallout following the February earthquake; and (ii) to identify possible misinformation, disinformation or malinformation targeting the humanitarian sector.



## The Americas

### Haiti

**06 July 2023:** In Tabarre neighbourhood, Port-au-Prince, around 20 armed men entered the MSF hospital, forcibly removing a patient being treated for gunshot wounds from the operating room.
