Documented incidents

03 March 2024: In Al-Madina Arab area, Gezira state, a doctor was shot and killed by RSF soldiers who opened fire inside Al-Madina Arab Hospital. **Source:** [Radio Tamazu](#)

07 March 2024: In Kadugli city, South Kordofan state, an ICRC vehicle was reportedly looted by an unidentified armed group while on a field visit. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

14 March 2024: In Gezira state, an unspecified number of nurses were raped by armed RSF soldiers inside Al Hasahysa Hospital. **Source:** [Personal Communication](#)
